## DR ZAFRULLAH CHOWDHURY

While I was contemplating to write few lines in remembrance of various contributions of NRBs (Non-resident Bangladeshi) during liberation war against Pakistan in 1971, a great number of common and well-established Bangladesh persons in UK flash back . In an interview of a British journalist with Mr. Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, elected leader of East Pakistan was broadcasted in ITN TV probably on 25th March 1971. As the discussion with Pakistan President General Yahia Khan had failed, no way left except struggle for freedom of Bangladesh. Pakistan Army's massacre in Dhaka on 25th and 26th March 1971 started published in various British newspapers, following which East Pakistan physicians working and studying in UK contacted each other over phone to form Bangladesh Medical Association, UK on 10th April 1971 with Eye Surgeon, Dr Abu Hena Sayedur Rahman, popularly known as Khasru bhai as the President, Dr MA Hakim as Vice-president, Dr. Zafarullah Chowdhury as the General Secretary, Dr. MA Mobin, former General Secretary of Chittagong Medical College Students' Union and Dr. Altafur Rahman former Vice-President of Rajshahi Medical College Students' Union as joint secretary. An account was opened in Midland bank (now known as HSBC). It was decided that every East Pakistan Physician living in UK shall contribute minimum £10 (ten) pounds every month. Dr. Fazlul Huq from Scotland and Dr. M. Bakht Majumdar from Kent committed to pay at least £25 pounds every month. During that period, Justice Abu Sayeed Chowdhury the then Vice- chancellor of Dhaka University was passing through London from Geneva. He was not aware of the Pakistan Army's massacre in Dhaka. We met him in London, requested him not to go back as his life will be in danger but to take the leadership of UK NRBs.

The Ganges Restaurant of Tasadduq Ahmed was the meeting place of a number of British Member of Parliaments and the Bangladeshi Left student Leaders of the NRBs assembled in Trafalgar Square and Hyde Park corner to promote the freedom struggle of Bangladesh. The movement was further strengthen with Mr. Mohiuddin Ahmed, 2nd Secretary of Pakistan High Commission leaving the Pakistan Government and joined the freedom struggle. Lulu Bilkis Banu, Abdul Matin




Chowdhury, Zakaria Chowdhury, Wali Ashraf, Shamsul Alam Chowdhury, Serajur Rahman of BBC, Tony Haque, SK Mannan, Sultan Sharif, Runi Khan, Fazle Hasan Abed and many others spearhead the movement. Thousands of Bangladesh workers living in UK contributed their time and money generously even sharing the same bed to donate the saved rent to Bangladesh Fund.

They organized meetings with Justice Abu sayeed Chowdhury in various places of UK. East Pakistan students with Dr. Khondoker Moshraf Hussain, presently with BNP marched towards Pakistan High Commission enchanting "Joy Bangla" slogan and demanded the release of Banga Bandu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman. Few students went on hunger stike in front of the 10 Downing street, the residence of British Prime Minister:

A good number of young English men and women formed 'Action Bangladesh' with the leadership of Paul Connect and Marietta Procopé whose residence was given free of rent for meetings and office purposes. They organized meetings with British MPs and leaders of all political parties and media.

It is most unfortunate that, Government and most People of Bangladesh have forgotten the contribution of NRBs who had one so much in support of the freedom struggle. Without their continued support, contributions and the leadership of Justice Abu Sayeed Chowdhury great leader SK Mujib would not be released from Pakistan prison. The role of Bangladesh Government in exile is also undermined and forgotten. Last but not the least, I am very pleased to know the activities of Voice for Global Bangladeshis to promote contribution of NRBs during freedom struggle of Bangladesh in 1971. Please continue help building better economy and good governance in Bangladesh. Whenever any of your member visit Bangladesh please request them to visit Gonoshasthaya Kendra to be acquainted with our activities for promoting better health care with nominal costs. Bangladesh needs your continued support. 'Voice for Global Bangladeshis' may lead the way. I wish Dr. Hasanat Husain, MBE's effort to promote cause and contribution of NRBs through Voice for Global Bangladeshis a success. NRBs should given VIP treatment at Bangladesh Airports and a card depicting 'We salute NRBs with deepest Gratitude, Love and Respect' from People of Bangladesh, he given to each of NRBs. I join you in spirit.

There was very fruitful and meaningful General Discussion in the Parliament on that



day. Different Bangladesh Action Committees staged candle light procession around the Parliament while the Discussion was in progress. The British Parliament deliberated the issue of Bangladesh many times in the British Parliament which helped greatly in creating global sympathy and support in favour of the Liberation War of Bangladesh. The Media of the UK played a leading role in publishing news and views supporting the just cause of Bangladesh. After long 50 years of our Liberation War and establishing of Bangladesh, I would like to salute and express our gratefulness to the People, Parliament and Media of UK for their great contribution and support for our Liberation War.

16th December 1971 was the day when Bangladesh was liberated from Pakistani military junta by a war where millions perished. It can be recalled that in the 1970 general election of Pakistan; despite the fact that the East Pakistanis won majority of the seats, the then military rulers (instead of handing over power), unleashed a reign of terror on civilians in the nights of 25th/26th March 1971

As soon as the news of the Genocide by the Pakistani Army reached London, Trafalgar square was flooded by protesting East Pakistanis. Bangladesh Action Groups were formed in every major cities in the UK. They provided the first foreign currency reserve for the Bangladesh Government formed in Kolkata (India) in exile. They sent and paid for lawyers to fight for Sheikh Mujibur Rahman who was accused of 'Agortola conspiracy' against Pakistan, they sent money to buy arms to fight for freedom, some left their jobs, factories, restaurants and families in the UK to join the liberation forces in Bangladesh.

Fifty years have passed by and, no governments in Bangladesh ever felt the necessity to recognise properly the sacrifices made by the commonwealth citizens, the then overseas Bangladeshis known as East Pakistanis for liberation of a motherland of their own. Therefore, on the occasion of the 50th anniversary of Bangladesh Independence, we in our Voice for Global Bangladeshis VfGB Executives' meeting at Corbridge, Newcastle, UK on 12 July 2021; took a decision to honour the contribution of those NRBs (Non Resident Bangladeshis) with our deepest gratitude, love and respect.

It was decided to celebrate the 50th anniversary of Bangladesh Independence by launching 'NRB Awards' for those who contributed to the liberation war effort of Bangladesh in 1970/71, from abroad.





We assigned two research cells, to find out the names and addresses of those people irrespective of party political, family or any other affiliation, A NRB Award Steering Group with six sub committees was formed, members of which had worked relentlessly, to meet deadlines and to oversee that the event becomes a memorable one. A souvenir booklet has been published and in that, we have published the first list of 100 NRBs. There will be many more names on the 16th December 2022 to coincide with the Victory Day.

With the help of Rt. Hon. Stephen Timms MP, we have booked House of Commons' Terrace Pavilion for Tuesday the 29th of March 2022, the nearest day available to the 26th March Bangladesh Independence Day. We tried to locate as many of those NRBs as possible and invited them; many have passed away, some have moved back to Bangladesh and where possible, we tried to invite their children to come, attend and receive the award on their behalf. Ours is a continuous search for the people who from overseas contributed in individual or collective capacity. If you know anyone whose name needs to be included in our list please do get in touch and we shall do our best.

It is with great pride and personal satisfaction, I can say that we have started a process to show our collective Respect (শ্রদ্ধাঞ্জলি) and Gratitude (কৃতজ্ঞতা) to the NRBs.

We also take this opportunity to salute those hundreds and thousands known and unknown martyrs who died in cities, towns, villages, roads, rivers and canals in Bangladesh; fighting to liberate our dear homeland Bangladesh. They had a dream for 'the riches of freedom and the security of justice' and it is upon us, to fulfil that dream.

Kalam Mahmud Abu Taher Choudhury is a very well-known personality amongst the Bangladeshi Community in the UK.

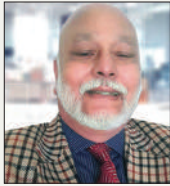
